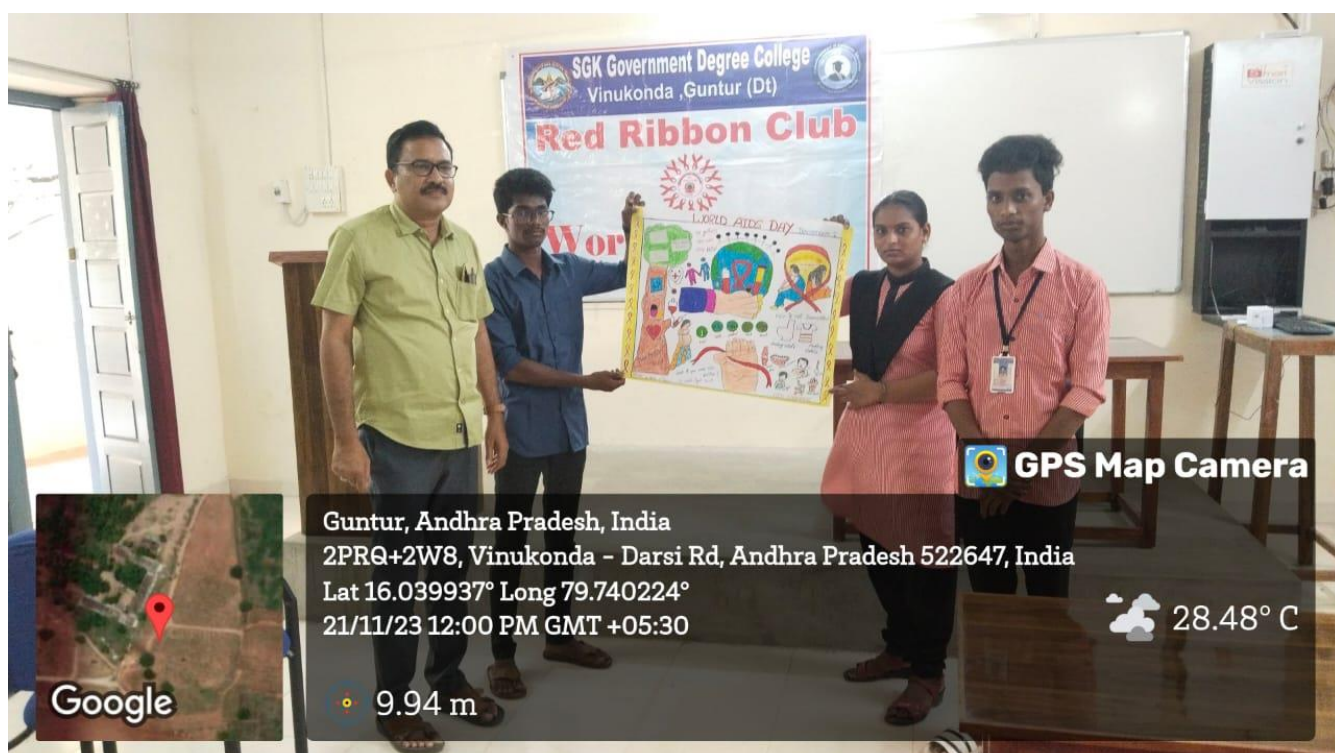


Fig 2 Student from I B.Sc (Chemistry) presenting their poster

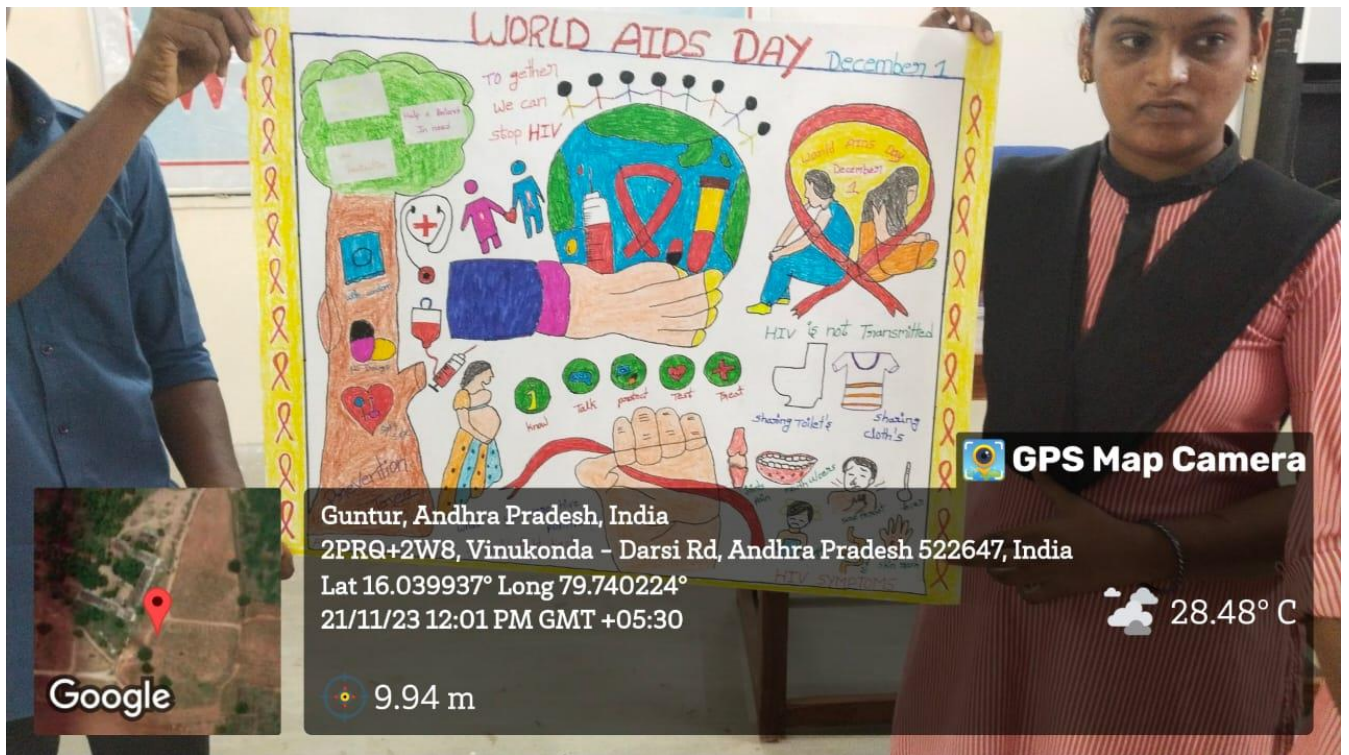


Fig 3 Students from III B.Z.C presenting their poster
