On the 24th of November 2023, an educational tour was organized by the Science Departments of SGK Government Degree College, Vinukonda. The tour included visits to key locations near Narasaraopeta, including Vallabha Feeds, Forest Department Nursery, Tri Koteswara Botanical Garden, and the Zoo Park. The participation of both students and staff ensured a vibrant and engaging experience for all involved.

The tour commenced with a visit to Vallabha Feeds located on NH 544D - Guntur Road, Narasaraopeta. Here, students had the opportunity to observe the processes involved in animal feed production. They learned about the ingredients used, the nutritional requirements of different animals, and the importance of quality control in feed manufacturing. This visit provided valuable insights into the agricultural and livestock sector, aligning with the curriculum of biology and agriculture.

Following the visit to Vallabha Feeds, the group proceeded to the Forest Department Nursery. Here, students were introduced to various native plant species and learned about the significance of Aforestation and conservation efforts. They engaged in hands-on activities such as seed planting and sapling transplantation under the guidance of forestry experts. This segment of the tour emphasized the importance of biodiversity conservation and ecological sustainability.

The tour concluded with a visit to the Zoo Park, offering students the opportunity to observe various animal species in a controlled habitat. They learned about animal behaviour, habitat requirements, and conservation challenges facing wildlife. Interpretive sessions by zookeepers provided insights into animal care, breeding programs, and conservation initiatives. Students were encouraged to reflect on the ethical considerations associated with captive animal management and biodiversity conservation.

The educational tour to Kotappakonda proved to be a fulfilling and enriching experience for both students and staff alike. Through visits to Vallabha Feeds, the Forest Department Nursery, Tri Koteswara Botanical Garden, and the Zoo Park, participants gained practical insights into various scientific disciplines, including agriculture, botany, and zoology.
